What Should A Professional Interior Paint Job Look Like?

Many homeowners are unsure of what to expect from a painting contractor when it comes to service and quality. They may not recognize the difference between an average paint job and one of high quality. Unfortunately, low standards in the painting industry have led to the acceptance of subpar work. Once you experience truly exceptional painting, any inferior work will stand out immediately. A great paint job goes beyond just the color. Its quality depends on proper preparation of the surfaces. Without thorough prep work, even the most beautiful color won't achieve its full potential. One clear sign of a poor paint job is uneven or imprecise cut-in lines, where walls meet ceilings, baseboards, or trims. Sharp, clean lines require both skill and patience to perfect. Additionally, the paint application should result in a smooth, uniform finish, free of brush marks, lap lines, drips, or debris. A high-quality paint job speaks for itself through its flawless execution.



Paint Shouldn't Be Where It Doesn't Belong!

Wall paint should never spill over onto window or door frames, nor should it extend onto the ceiling—arguably one of the worst examples of poor painting technique. Surfaces such as cabinets, floors, light switches, outlets, fixtures, door hardware, and hinges should remain free of paint. In the photo on the left, you can see a wavy line at the top of the wall where the paint extends into the ceiling's edge. On the right, a proper cut-in showcases a clean, straight line where the wall and ceiling meet perfectly.





It goes without saying that paint should not be on flooring, furniture, or personal belongings. This is beyond unskilled painting, it's just plain carelessness. The surfaces and items in the painting space should be protected with drop sheets and plastic. There may be items on the surfaces being painted that need to be masked and taped.










Full Paint Coverage and Number of Coats

Proper paint coverage means there should be no thin spots or shadows of the previous color showing through. Many homeowners may not realize this, as it's not always obvious without experience. With years in the industry, we can instantly spot surfaces that lack full coverage, whether it's sparse paint in cut-in areas, missed spots in rolled sections, or the old color peeking through. In most cases, one coat of paint isn't enough, no matter how high-quality or expensive the paint may be. To achieve proper and complete coverage, a minimum of two coats is typically required. In some situations, more than two coats are necessary—this is especially true when making a dramatic color change, such as painting a light color over a dark one or using a vibrant hue.







Sanding, Sanding And More Sanding

A good painter is often better described as a professional sander. Sanding is one of the most crucial yet often overlooked steps in painting preparation. It's the foundation of a quality paint job. When surfaces are painted without proper sanding—or skipped altogether—the results can be disastrous. 



